Wells is a redshirt junior on the University of Northern Iowa (UNI) football team. He has been a very positive role model for the youth, especially delinquent youth, in the Waterloo, Iowa community. Wells is a volunteer youth mentor with the *Iuvenile Court Services* in Waterloo and at the Central Iowa Juvenile *Detention Center*. His passion is to build relationships and guide young men of color, teaching them how to make better life choices and get out of the judicial system. Wells also volunteers at Tomorrow's Leaders/Uplift Foundation, Center of Attention where he has designed weekly curriculum to help young participants understand the importance of goal setting, responsible social media use, building healthy relationships, and good decision making skills. In addition, Wells volunteers at *Tomorrow's Leaders Youth After* School Program where he assist with academic success and positive interactions among diverse groups.

Wells serves on the *Minority Student-Athlete Leadership Team* at UNI.
