



KOHL ANDERSON – TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY

Anderson is a senior sprinter on the Texas A&M Track and Field team. As vice president of Aggies' SAAC, Anderson has attended Southeastern Conference SAAC meetings and assisted in planning community service events for Aggie student-athletes; such as Aggies CAN (a canned food drive that raised over \$40,000 last year to donate to flood relief in South Carolina and our local food bank). Anderson also serves as both a student worker and an ambassador for the Texas A&M University System Board of Regents.

Galyer is a senior swimmer on the University of Kentucky Swimming and Diving team. Galyer is a College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America First Team recipient. She is the first Wildcat swimmer to earn CoSIDA first-team honors in nearly two decades (last recipient was 1997-98). She was also named the Southeastern Conference (SEC) Female Scholar Athlete of the Year for two consecutive years. In addition to these honors, Galyer is named an All-SEC Second Team and SEC Community Service Team honoree.

Galyer has made a faithful commitment to volunteering for community service since her freshman year at UK. She has volunteered several hours with Salvation Army, delivering blankets to UK Children's Hospital patients, and serving breakfast at Ronald McDonald House. Galyer has participated in book reading at Tates Creek Middle School and assisted with the American Cancer Society golf tournament. Annually, Galyer volunteers with the "Back Pack" program delivering back packs, food, and clothing to needy students.
